Quick & Easy Peanut Butter Dog Treats



Ingredients

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter*
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 cup water

Instructions

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350 F.
- 2. Mix together your flour, peanut butter & eggs in a large bowl until slightly combined.
- 3. Add in a little bit of water (approximately one Tbsp at a time) until the mixture becomes wet enough to roll out as dough.
- 4. Roll out your dough & cut out your favorite shapes with some cookie cutters.
- 5. Place your treats onto your baking sheet & cook for about 15 minutes. For a little bit of crunch I like to take mine out once the bottoms start to darken.

Homemade Dog Biscuits

Treat your furry friend with homemade dog biscuits! Your fur-baby will love these treats made with peanut butter, flaxseed, whole wheat and beef broth!



Prep Time 5 minutes Cook Time 20 minutes Total Time 19 minutes

Ingredients

- □ 1 cup oats
- □ 1/2 cup flaxseed
- □ 1/2 to 1 cups beef broth
- □ 1/4 cup peanut butter

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° F.
- 2. In a medium bowl, stir together the flour, oats and flaxseed. Mix in 1/2 cup beef broth and peanut butter. Mix well, adding additional beef broth if necessary to bring the mixture together to a thick dough. Form into a ball and turn out on a lightly floured surface.
- 3. Roll to about 1/4 inch thickness and cut out to desired shape.
- 4. Bake for about 20 minutes or until golden brown, flipping halfway.
- 5. Cool completely, then keep in an airtight container for about one week.



Sweet Potato Fries for Dogs

We all need our veggies, and luckily sweet potato seems to be quite popular with our canine friends. For this homemade dog treat recipe you'll need a sweet potato, coconut oil, cinnamon, and turmeric. These are a great way for both you and your pup to get in some of your daily vegetable servings — they're delicious.

Four ingredients, 30 minute cook time.

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 30 minutes Total Time: 40 minutes

Ingredients

- 1 Sweet Potato
- 1 tbsp Coconut Oil (melted)
- Spices Turmeric, Cinnamon

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F
- 2. Wash and peel the sweet potato
- 3. Cut the sweet potato into evenly sized long skinny (fry shaped) pieces
- 4. Coat with oil and spices Mix in a large bowl or Ziploc bag
- 5. Place fries on baking sheet in one layer
- 6. Bake for 15 minutes
- 7. Flip over fries for even baking
- 8. Bake for another 10-15 minutes
- 9. Let cool before giving to your dog!



Easy DIY Dog Treats

This homemade dog treat recipe is extremely simple. If your dog does fine with wheat and milk I'd recommend trying this out if it's your first time baking dog treats. For this simple recipe you'll need two cups of whole wheat flour, one cup of peanut butter, one cup of skim milk, and a tablespoon of baking powder.

Four ingredients, 15-20 minute bake time.

Using dog bone cookie cutters makes these cookies super-cute, especially if you're making these as gifts. But if you don't have one, you can certainly use any shape of cookie cutter you like. Your dog won't mind one way or another.



Ingredients:

- 1 cup organic peanut butter
- 1 cup skim milk
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 2 cups whole-wheat flour, plus more for cutting out the cookies

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. In a medium-size mixing bowl, combine the peanut butter and milk. Drizzling the milk in slowly will allow you to combine it more efficiently.
- 3. In another large mixing bowl, combine the baking powder and whole-wheat flour.
- 4. Slowly add the dry ingredients to the peanut butter-milk mixture. Combine all of the ingredients until thoroughly mixed.
- 5. On a sheet of parchment paper, sprinkle a tiny bit of wheat flour on the surface and roll out the dough to reach your desired dog treat thickness. Using your dog bone cookie cutters, cut out dog treats and place them onto a greased cookie sheet.
- 6. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes.

Before making these dog treats, be sure you take your dog's dietary needs into consideration. Some dogs don't do well with peanut butter, while some dogs love it. As always, put your dog's best interests first. However, I've never met a dog that doesn't like homemade treats. They make wonderful gifts tied in baker's twine or delivered in small jars.
